The repetition of final <i>consonant</i> sounds following different <i>vowel</i> sounds in nearby wordsExample?
*A figure of speech that uses <i>deliberate exaggeration</i>
The repetition of <i>consonant</i> sounds at the <i>beginning</i> of wordsExample?
The voice which <i>speaks</i> in a poem (often independent of the poem's <i>author</i>)
A poem, usually of fourteen lines, in regulated meter and rhyme scheme, usually presenting and solving a problem (divided into either 8:6 or 4:4:4:2 lines)
*The above poem, in 8:6 line division
*The above poem, in 4:4:4:2 line division
*What the last <i>two</i> rhyming lines in the poem above are called
When words have the same or a similar sound within or at the end of a line of poetry
The <i>rhythm</i> of a poem
How that rhythm is <i>divided</i>
A <i>pause</i> in the middle or flow of a line of verse Example?
Reading a poem in terms of its rhythm
*A line of poetry in which a grammatical pause (punctuation) and the physical end of the line coincide
*Where one line of poetry ends and the next line begins (shown horizontally as a /)
When the thought of one line of verse carries into the next line without punctuation Example?
*Poetry without regular rhythm or rhymeExample?
Bonus: Repetition of an identical word or group of words in successive verses or clauses
